ABOUT THE ORGANIZERS

The Centre for Human Rights and Duties, Panjab University, Chandigarh in association with National Institute of Social Defence, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, New Delhi, is organizing an International Conference on the theme “Conversation for Change: Human Rights, Youth and Drugs” on 5 th and 6 th February, 2020. The conference will be a two-day event divided in different sessions presided over by the experts in the field.

The major areas of concern of NISD are Substance Abuse Prevention, Care of Older Persons, and Other Social Defence Issues including Beggary Prevention, Transgenders, etc.

THEME

“Conversation for Change: Human Rights, Youth and Drugs”

The problem of drug addiction is global affair with almost every country struggling to get rid of it. But this problem has taken different shape over years in the Northern region of India affecting the majority of youth population, which in itself a serious issue. India being between the Golden Crescent and Golden Triangle, both corners of India are victims of massive drug exports, while U.T. Chandigarh being on the North-Western corner is the most affected.

The Conference will consist of number of sessions in which presentations on various aspects of Drugs Usage and Prevention will be given by various experts in the field, followed by panel discussion.

The objectives of the Conference are:

- To deliberate upon the issue of drugs in India with special reference to North-Western region.

 - o Footnotes shall be typed in Times New Roman, Font size 10 and citations must be in accordance with APA Style Manual (6th Edition).
 - o A Uniform Formatting Style must be strictly adhered to while submitting the full papers.

HOW TO REACH

Chandigarh city, planned by the famous French architect Le Corbusier, it is known as one of the best experiments in urban planning and modern architecture in the 20 th century in India. It is situated near the picturesque foothills of Shivalik range of Himalaya and is a planned city of the country. The city has invited commendable scholarship from researchers, policymakers, civil society activists, architects, and planners from all across the globe.
